**Plant Sales and Benching Tags** –Plant Sale and Plant Benching Tags will be available at the August EDOS meeting from **Roy Jope**. Tags are also available for printing from the EDOS website – www.edos.org.au. (Remember that Benching Tags need to be printed on both sides) Please ensure that you use EDOS sale plant tags only. If you are unable to collect them at the meeting please contact Treasurer John Rooks.

**Craft Tags** – Craft Tags will be available at the August EDOS meeting from Pauline. If you are unable to collect them at the meeting please contact Treasurer John Rooks.

Plant Labels - It is very important that when benching plants that labels are easy to read. A clearly written label makes it much easier for everyone to read, and avoids the possibility of a plant being given an incorrect name in Competition Results. For any members who are unsure of, or would like to confirm that their plant labels are correct before benching, (either spelling or registration of crosses) EDOS will have available on Friday night prior to benching of plants, the Orchidwiz database for members to check their labels. Please see Ann Kable or Janelle Girdlestone.

**Member Number** - Your Member Number is on the newsletter envelope following your name, or available from the Plant Registrar. This number needs to be used if you are benching and/or selling plants.

**Fire Ant Register** – Legislation requires that Members sign the Fire Art Register before Plants can be accepted for either showing or Sales. This Register MUST be signed before Plants can be accepted into the Hall.

#### **Cut Flowers and Greenery**– Flower

arrangements have changed over the years, instead of pretty little filler flowers the ladies would prefer leaves like the cordylines, flax, crotons, anthurium, ferns, etc (leaves that will last a few days without wilting). We desperately need orchid flowers and foliage to work with.

The floral art ladies earn quite a lot of money for the society yet it is a constant battle to get flowers to work with. Any small containers that could be used for flower arranging would also be appreciated. If in doubt please phone Lyn on 3422 1589.

**Condition of Sale Plants** – Please ensure that any plants you may present for sale are virus free, clean and NOT recently potted. Plants need to be stable in the pots and not show any insect damage, etc.

If it is not a plant in the condition you would consider purchasing yourself, then please do not put it up for sale!

### Plants Worth Noting

At the last meeting there was a lovely specimen of Schomburgkia superbiens presented by Barry Kable. The plant was about seven and a half feet tall with 5 flowering spikes held high above the foliage. The flowers were a lovely shade of lilac-mauve about 4 to 5 inches in size with a darker lip and yellow callus. The plant itself was clean, well grown and a real credit to its owner, and to get it from home to the meeting was nothing short of amazing. The only fault with the plant was its home address ...hint hint Barry.

A phragmipedium called Mont Fallu which is a cross between grande and longifolium really caught my eye.

There were three flowers presenting themselves well above the foliage in an eye catching display. The flowers were green in colour with red brown markings with long dangling sepals reminiscent of the longifolium in its breeding. The foliage was clean and a lovely hue of green. Wish I could grow them as well as the owner of this plant.

There was a brilliant display of dendrochilums presented of various sizes and colours. As a person who struggles growing this species I was quite envious of all you growers who grow this species and grow it well. I was also taken by a Rhynchostylis gigantea spots cross red that was benched. It had a single raceme with many large flowers which were white with pink to mauve spots and a mauve labellum. A very showy species that will only improve as it grows into a larger plant.

Keep up the good growing.

### DATE CLAIMER

At our September meeting the Committee will be distributing seedling plants to attending members, as part of a growing competition. The object of this "Competition" is to see who can get their plant to flower first, with everyone starting as close to equal as possible.

Come along and be involved – it should be interesting, and fun as well.

#### **Cultural Notes**

Laelia superbiens

I purchased this plant as a 3 lead dividend of a much bigger plant from plant sales at West Brisbane Orchid show about 8 years ago, with a name tag Schomburgkia *superbiens*. I potted it on when needed, until it out grew a 300mm port pot, the only thing I could fit it in was a Yabbies sieve, where it is growing today.

The species occurs in Mexico, Honduras and Guatemala where it grows on trees in the open or damp forests or on rocks in low altitudes, some have been recorded with 13'or 4m inflorescences.

I have been growing it in a shade house with 2.7m high roof with 70% shade cloth and 50% cloth on the walls, until this year moving it to a new section with no cloth on Eastern wall and 4m high roof with 70% shade cloth. Giving it more water in Summer than most Orchids, fertilizing with organic and HSO22 in the growing season. Once every week Insecticide with Eco Oil , Azamax and Eco Rose fungicide, also follicle feed with Amino k and Hy San every 2<sup>nd</sup> week in Summer. A lot of air movement is essential. This is a very rewarding and easy Orchid to grow. Try one
