### **Plants Worth Noting November**

Many lovely orchids were benched at November's meeting. Several plants were worth noting, but I will limit my comments to Ken Haase's orchid, which was benched as *Epi*. Burdekin Honey 'Shona.'

It is currently accepted by Kew Gardens as *Cty*. Burdekin Honey 'Shona,' so I shall refer to the plant under that name.

Catyclia Burdekin Honey

Parents: Catyclia El Hatillo x Encyclia Bees'

Knees

Genus: Catyclia = Cattleya x Encyclia

Cultivar: 'Shona'

The plant was awarded an FCC/AOC with 85.9 points in November 2014. It flowers regularly and has upright spikes that branch. The petals and sepals are green with a red/purple labellum.

Cty. Burdekin Honey is composed of species of which 100% take high light and 75% take medium light. It grows in dappled light to bright indirect light, and likes cool to warm conditions. (58°F to 75°F at night.) It may be tolerant of hot (75°F to 85°F) night temperatures.

Humidity should be 50%-60%. Mature plants MUST dry out between waterings. Grow in a pot with a porous, free-draining media. Fertilize weekly, weakly (one quarter to half the normal dose).

# Further Information from Trevor Heitman's Talk

Trevor has very kindly supplied some of the details of the information from his talk at the November meeting. I have included photos of the books he was referring to in the "EDOS on Show" attached to this Newsletter (with some information on availability).

### Plant of the Month November

### Paph. Isobel 'Isabella'

Our Paph. Isobel 'Isabella' has been grown in a bush house covered with clear solarweave on the roof, south and west sides and 50 % shade cloth all over. Additional shade cloth is provided for cooling in summer. So the plant receives what might be described as high light for Paphs, essentially our cattleya conditions. The bush house is in a very well-ventilated location. We only use fans to ensure water dries out of the crowns of plants after watering or fertilizing. Humidity is provided by a crushed recycled concrete floor and wetting it in summer. The temperature range is roughly 10 to 35 degrees.

This *paphiopedilum* is grown in a mix of 40% medium and small bark, 40% medium and small charcoal and 20% perlite.

Watering is done automatically three times per week in summer and once a week in winter. This is occasionally varied according to weather conditions. The plants are hand fertilized approximately fortnightly all year around with some weeks missed in winter. Both Wolfgang's paphiopedilum mix and Peter's Professional are the fertilizers used. We have tried other fertilizers and additives over time but have not noticed any significant advantage.

We have very little fungal problems in this environment. Rogor, Malathion or Fortune 500 are used for mealy bugs when present.

When flower spikes appear, they are generally staked to ensure good presentation and once the flowers start to open, the plant is brought into a well-lit inhouse location for additional protection.
