

Cultural Notes

Den Royal Wings `Maria' HCC /AOC .

I currently grow my plant under 70% green shade cloth where it is fertilized with Horticultural Solutions Duett on a daily basis at a very reduced rate whenever the sun is shining . This is done as a very light foliar spray with a little heavier going down into the mix about once a week As you all know I like my food and so do my orchids .

The potting mix I use is one third super coarse perlite, one third granulated styrene, and one third coconut peat available from Fame Orchids. This mix drains well but with enough moisture retention to carry the plant on the overcast days when I don't water. I also like to add a topping of 10 mm gravel on top of the mix to hold the styrene in and also discourage any moss growth that you may get when using smaller gravel sizes.

With this particular plant I hang it quite high in the shade house and generally lower it down as the flowers start to develop as the plant told me on its first flowering when I cooked all its blooms. Insect and fungal damage does not seem to worry this plant because it is hanging so high where it gets good air movement but it will cop the occasional dose of Supracide and Phosjet when spraying the catts below.

The main advantage of growing this particular genus is the longevity of the blooms, anything up to 5 months, and after all isn't this why we grow orchids in the first place.

PLANTS WORTH NOTING -

JUNE 2013

There were numerous plants worth a mention however here are a few that took my fancy.

The first to catch my attention was Den Royal Wings Maria HCC/AOCQOS. This was a large well grown plant with numerous heads of blooms which impressed the judges as they awarded it the plant of the month.

Another eye catcher was Dtps Da-Chien Spider Beauty. I am not overly impressed with some of this type as the pattern can be so uneven on each bloom and it takes away the overall presentation, however this display was well presented and the spotted pattern was uniform on every flower.

I couldn't go past the Paph section, Paph (Mem Robert Ward x Singing Minstral) x (Canticle x Macabre) - with those parents you would expect something special and this plant did not disappoint. The plant was healthy, the flower stem was tall and straight and the flower presented itself perfectly, a credit to its owner's culture.

Lastly Ascda Ken Kone m/c, there were 3 plants tabled and my guess is they came from the same flask, the orange/yellow tonings are always popular and the shape and flower count put on an impressive display, a credit their owners.
