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Plants Worth Noting

A quick look around the benches, and a couple of plants caught my eye. The first was Cycnodes (Cycd.) Jumbo Puff with two well displayed sprays, which was sitting on the bench next to Cycd. Wine Delight, making a spectacular display on the bench. Cycd. is a hybrid genus comprising of Cycnoches (Natural Genus) and Mormodes (Natural genus), Cycd. Jumbo Puff is a cross between Cycnoches warscewiczii and Mormodes badia. Cycd. is pronounced as sik-NOE-keez. Cycd. grow in the high temperature and humidity of the rain forest of Central and South America and are both easily cultivated, however these plants need a distinctive dry period over the winter months where they need no water until they start the new growth. Care should be taken not to allow water in the new growth until it is well established. Cycnodes and Mormodes is a very successful breeding combination producing multiple flowers and vigorous growth characteristics.

The second plant that caught my eye was *Bulbophyllum* (*Bulb.*) *burfordiense*. *Bulb.* is a species found in Papua New Guinea and the Eastern side of Indonesia up to 500m above sea level. A small sized, hot to cool growing epiphyte with ovoid to conical pseudo bulbs carrying a single, apical leaf and blooms in the spring on a basal, erect, 8" [20 cm] long, single flowered inflorescence requiring light shade, ample water and good air circulation, it is found in upper tree branches and produces slightly stinky flowers that attract flies as pollinators.

Cultural Award for June 14

Sophronitis cernua

Described by Lindley in 1828 as the type for the species.

First examples of *cernua* were collected by William Harrison, a Brazilian merchant from Liverpool who sent them to his relative in Liverpool in 1826. He collected *cernua* from trees growing where the city of Rio de Janeiro is now located. The species is fairly wide spread in S.E. Brazil, found on trees and rock in coastal lowlands and inland savannah, at a latitude and location similar to Brisbane, making it an ideal addition to local collections.

I acquired my *Soph. cernua* from Easy Orchids on 2.3.12 as a mini plant mounted on a small piece of coarse black tree fern bark where it appeared happy enough. However I intended to transfer it in spring when fist root growth commences to a slab of red fine fibered tree fern. Bill and Margaret Williams of Cleveland have a splendid plant growing on this material.

On 20th Sept.2012 as planned I added a slab of red tree fern to existing mount and it has turned into a vigorous plant. The only downside to the red tree fern mount is it is susceptible to Ph. problems causing fungal growth. I have countered this by heavily flushing with water and spraying with phosphoric acid 2 mls per litre water monthly.

I house my *cernua* along with all my plants in a modest 4 x 3 m shade house covered in winter and summer with 50 and 70% shade cloth respectively plus solar weave covering the roof and about 80% of the side area which gives good air flow as the enclosure is in a fairly exposed position. *Cernua's* only special treatment is to be hung on the southern wall under a top shelf where it gets a little more shade and a bit less air flow.

I believe nutrition is very important in cultivating healthy orchids, and I feed *Soph. cernua* with the best I can obtain. I use a balanced fertilizer NPK 15:3:12 (including trace elements) that contains only nitrogen in its simplest form, nitrogen nitrate which is immediately available to the plants and formulations containing urea are avoided.

I water with tank water and fertilize all my *Cattleyas* 150 ppm N every 5 days in summer (On especially hot days I water daily) decreasing to 35ppm every 10 days in winter and increasing the duration in inclement weather. I also give a monthly feed of Sea Sol combined with the fertilizer. As my *Soph. cernua* is mounted, I water it every 2nd or 3rd day in summer and in winter treat like all my other Catts.

Orchid Display during RNA Show 2014

The aim is to showcase orchids grown in SE Queensland in a display at the Brisbane Exhibition. This will consist of a joint display with as many societies participating as possible, hopefully creating some public interest in orchids and orchid growing with a view to increased member recruitment. A hand out sheet with contact details of all Orchid Societies in South East Queensland will be available.

We have been allocated a space of 4m x 4m in the Horticultural Pavilion at the RNA.

The display will consist of orchids grouped by genus with appropriate signage, in front of a large map of Queensland with flags to indicate approximate locations of Orchid Societies and a large TV monitor playing a continuous power-point presentation of orchid photos.

There will be two free raffles per day for the public, one draw for a free orchid plant and one for a free membership to a club of their choosing.

It is considered that around 200 orchids and suitable foliage plants will be needed for the display and a list (though incomplete) has been compiled.

Setup of the display will commence on Saturday 2nd August with a group starting the roughing out of setting up and moving the heavy gear into place.

Actual setup will take place on Thursday 7th with Margaret Tierney and two male "lifters" setting up the display ready for opening on Friday 8th.

To minimise congestion at the RNA grounds it has been decided to have two depots for the drop off of orchid plants. The plants can then be loaded into suitable vans and delivered to the RNA grounds.

On the Southside, the drop-off address will be 281 Redland Bay Road, Capalaba – the home of Barry and Ann Kable (3824 5931) and on the north side at Albert & Ann Gibbard's residence at 11 Barrabui Street, Bracken Ridge (3269 1631).

Plants to be delivered to these addresses by the **pm of Wednesday 6th August.**

Note: Each pot should contain a separate label with the name of the club and the grower's name; also each club should provide a list of plants supplied by that club to each of the depots.

Four people per day (2 morning and 2 afternoon) for the 10 days will be required to man the display. Shifts being 9am to 1pm and 1pm to around 6pm

If you would like to Volunteer please contact Barry possible please. Volunteers will need to have a broad knowledge of orchids and how to grow them. Also if you would be willing to do a 20 minute talk on the Garden Stage please contact Barry.

Details for retrieving plants will be finalised at the next meeting of the planning group which will be held 26th July.
