QOS will be having David Banks as their Guest Speaker at their meeting on July 11. David has been growing and researching orchids for many years, and is the proprietor of Hills District Orchids in Sydney. He is also the current Editor of Australian Orchid Review.

### Cultural Award For May

#### Coelogyne rochussenii

This plant was purchased as a seedling some years ago at the Tweed Heads orchid show and has grown under 75% shadecloth ever since. The plant at EDOS

was a division of the original plant. In it's natural habitat it is normally epiphyte on trees over hanging rivers in Malaysia, Borneo, Java and the Philippines. The long pendant lemon scented inflorescences last for approx 2 weeks and put on quite a display reaching 1 metre in length on an adult plant. This plant has been fertilised every week and it is grown in a mixture of jumbo perlite, small bark and small coconut husk.

This is an easy plant to grow and prefers more water than most, certainly a worthy addition to any collection, the only drawback of this plant is if you grow it into a large specimen it is a problem to transport to meetings!

#### PLANTS WORTH NOTING

For this time of year there was a good variety of plants benched. The following are some that caught my eye.

Phal. Taisuco Swan Chingruey No.2
This large plant had 8 huge white blooms well presented on an arching spray. I commented to the owner that I would be surprised if this plant did not end up on the front table, and it did.

#### Paph. fairrieanum

This small plant had a well presented flower with good colouration and shape. On the label it had written from Ivan's Orchids August 2009, I'm guessing this would have been in a tube at that stage so getting it to flower under 2 years is a very good result.

Cat. percivaliana (Summit x Alberts)

Is a very easy growing species from Venezuela where it is found growing on moss covered rocks. Normally this species prefers brighter light and a little less water than other Cattleyas. This plant had 10 well presented flowers and looked a treat.

Den. Frasers Canary Twister 'Asternova' (*Den. schulleri x Den. canuliculatum*)

This plant on the night was not on the bench per say, it was presented to be judged and received an award

HCC or possibly an AM yet to be finalised. The plant had 3 tall sprays of citrus yellow flowers approx 60 in total and it was admired by all. One parent *Den.* schulleri rates a mention, this is a near mythical species from Northern New Guinea and I guess this is where the yellowish colouration comes from. Certainly a credit to the owner and worthy of an award.

## CONDY'S CRYSTALS (Potassium permanganate)

This little gem has many uses. It is readily available and relatively cheap, and an alternative to the "less environmentally-friendly" chemicals (but keep your hands out of the solution, otherwise you will end up with discoloured skin!!). Listed below are some of its uses.

A solution of Condy's Crystals is a good all-round remedy for many orchid ailments. When deflasking seedlings, rinse the young plants in a weak solution – about 3 grains to 5 litres of water. A new plant which looks distressed can be soaked in Condy's using solution of 3 grains to the litre.

To use as a sterilising solution for pots etc, use enough Condy's to turn the water blood red

A few grains of Condy's added to fertilisers and pesticides when spraying will help fight diseases, it will decrease the amount of blackspot on your plants, and by adding this small amount of potassium it will improve the vigour of your plants, and also help develop better flowers.

On the 'human' front, it is a very successful treatment for ailments like tinea and other fungal infections.
