Plants Worth Noting - May

Bulbophyllum medusae

When I saw this species at the May meeting, I chose it because it is a very elegant *Bulbophyllum* which always attracts attention when benched and because of its interesting name.

Also of interest, at our May meeting was *Bulb*. Tiger Spider (awarded Judges Choice) which has *Bulb*. *medusae* for one of the parents - the other parent being *Bulb*. *gracillimum*.

In Greek mythology, **Medusa** was a monster, a Gorgon, generally described as a winged human female with a hideous face and having venomous snakes in place of hair. This bulbophyllum is named after Gorgon Medusa of Greek mythology because the long lateral sepals of its flowers are rather like the snakes that formed Medusa's hair.

This *Bulbophyllum* originates from a wide area of southeast Asia - peninsular Thailand, Malaya, Malaysia,

Borneo, the Indonesian islands of Sumatra and Bangka, and the Lesser Sunda Islands. It grows in lowland forests, sometimes high in trees under a closed canopy, and at other times lower on the trees in more open locations. Consequently it likes warm conditions with shaded to dappled light. In the wild it is epiphytic and lithophytic - a creeping orchid which can spread to cover the pot or slab it is growing on.

I am told by an avid 'Bulbo' grower that *Bulb. medusae* likes to be kept moist, not allowed to dry out in summer and should be kept a little on the dry side in winter. They are being grown well in shallow open baskets locally. The plant may have many clusters of flowers—with each cluster containing 30 to 100 tiny flowers, each with long slender sepals up to 150 mm long. The only *Bulb. medusae* awarded in Australia was *Bulbophyllum medusa* 'Lyn' in 1997 in the Northern Territory. From the picture above, it appears to have 15 clusters of flowers. Perhaps our climate is not quite as suitable as in the Northern Territory but wouldn't it be wonderful to see a plant like this here.

Plant of Night April Meeting

Paphiopedilum henryanum

This particular *Paph. henryanum* was purchased as a small seedling from Ivan Vescovi. For us, it has been an average grower and flowerer. The quality of *henryanum* flowers vary considerably with the top quality ones having much fuller and flatter dorsals than this clone.

Paph. henryanum is a species from southwest China where the plants grow at 2,000-3,000ft. (610-910m)

This *Paph.henryanum* is grown in a semi-closed-in environment with clear Alsynite roof and sides. The roof is covered with 50% shade cloth so the plant receives what might be described as high light for Paphs. Ventilation is enhanced by an overhead fan and a whirly bird and humidity is provided by a gravel floor, a shower tray of water underneath the benches and a humidifier set at 65% humidity. The temperature range is roughly 10 to 35 degrees, occasionally going up to 43 and down to 4 degrees centigrade.

This paphiopedilum is grown in a mix of 40% medium and small bark, 40% medium and small charcoal and 20% perlite. It was reported in 2010 and again in 2014 which is perhaps longer than ideal.

Watering is done automatically three times per week in summer and once a week in winter. This is occasionally supplemented according to weather conditions. The plants are hand fertilized approximately fortnightly all year around with some weeks missed in winter. Wolfgang's Paph mix has been the main fertilizer used with some applications of Aquasol. We have tried other fertilizers and additives over time but have not noticed any significant advantage.

A Mancozeb and Octave mix are used when needed for leaf fungal problems while Confidor, occasionally Rogor, Malathion and Crown have been used for mealy bugs when present.

When flower spikes appear, they are staked to ensure good presentation and once the flowers are developed they are brought into a well-lit location under the house for additional protection.
