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Cultural Notes

ONC. SHARRY BABY 'SWEET FRANGRANCE' (Jamie Sutton x Honolulu)

This has to be one of the easiest orchids to grow, not as tough as Dancing Ladies but almost. Thankfully Sharry Baby likes a fair bit of water as most of the plants that I grow do. Watch the pseudobulbs in winter to see that they don't shrivel as you need to water less at this time. They grow incredibly fast, I bought this plant as a seedling about 6 years ago and this is 1/3. of the original plant. My mix is .1/3 jumbo perlite,1/3 small bark, 1/3 medium coconut husk with a sprinkling of rooster booster in the top half of the mix. This plant is grown under 75% shade cloth and watered 2-3 times a week in summer and once a week in winter. The chocolate/vanilla fragrance in the mornings is simply wonderful; if you could bottle that for the ladies of the world you could make a fortune. The inflorescences need staking to present them at their best as they can reach over 1 metre in length. This particular plant has 6 inflorescences up to 1 metre tall and approx. total flower count of 400. This plant is a wonderful addition to any collection.

Plants Worth Noting

EDOS February 2011 meeting

The standard of plants in the novice section demonstrates a great future for the club. We look forward to even bigger brighter better displays at the next show. Well done.

In the Australian native section there was only one contender. A lonely plant of Dendrobium monophyllum.

This can grow into a large specimen plant and thrives on neglect in the home garden. a multi flowered yellow bells is a sight to see. The best way to ensure that there are always native plants is to acquire a few and look after them.

The little Schoenorchis fragrans took my eye. If you blinked you could miss it. The proportion of flowers to green stuff is good and you get the added bonus of a perfume.

The lovely Bulbophyllum graveolens var robustum was delightful. It produces a bold colour statement. This species can have many colour forms and is quite spectacular.

In the Cattleya novelty section it was interesting to see the influence of Caudebec as a parent. Some time back Ross Maidment a guest speaker recommended its potential. The offspring on the table all demonstrated a tall robust multi flowered display. This time all had spotted progeny that were very pleasing to the eye.

In the Cattleya Exhibition the plant of BLC Mt Isa Jean caught my eye. The bright yellow with a red velvet lip with it's yellow flares makes a statement. A worthy addition to any collection.

In the Cattleya novelty the lovely little Ctna Aloha Jewel cross really caught my eye. I'm a sucker for sweet petite and the yellow concolour full shape little gem appealed to me.

The Paph Harold Koopowitz stood out from the crowd, the large yellow with red brown lines was a fine example of the specialist breeding. The parents P. rothschildianum has multi flowered spikes of thin very long pendulous petals while the P. malipoense is a single green, full round shape with freckles.

The outstanding plant of the night for me was Cycnoches Tawny Bar. The colour was a pinky brown with dark brown freckles. The thirty to forty flowers gave a wonderful display. I started to count them but life's too short. Seeing this plant encouraged me to have another

go at Cycnoches. I may succumb at the Queensland Orchid Fair and see if I can do better this time.
