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EDOS Autumn Show 2010

EDOS Members take a bow! Our recent Autumn Show was a great success, with 684 people through the door. We benched 235 plants, which considering the recent climatic conditions was excellent. Plant sales were well supported with 882 plants finding new homes. Thanks to all members who offered their assistance.

Plants Worth Noting

The plant that really caught my eye was Miltassia Radermaker 'Hsi Moi'.

To me this was a real stunner. It didn't rate with the judges or the popular voters but it won me. I could definitely find a place for this plant in my greenhouse. It had large full shape dark purple blooms on a long upright spray. Miltonias are generally a cool growing genus and are better suited to Melbourne weather. The ones that do well here are generally the more temperate growing star shaped species and crosses.

This one having a much fuller shape would fall into the more difficult cultural requirements category. Congratulations to Margaret and Glen Drewett, the growers as their growing conditions must just suit this clone.

New grower, Ian Want asked if we could identify his tabled plant which was a white Dendrobium with a faint purple spot deep in the throat. Luckily I was able to confirm that yes it was an orchid. The best that I come up with is that it probably has elements of some Den dicuphum and one or more doses of Den bigibbum var. alba. But whatever else is anybody's guess. It's a lovely orchid and deserves a place in the greenhouse but with a lost tag its identity will remain elusive. Let's see if it's still in bloom next month.

I have a little Dendrobium dicuphum out in flower at the moment. It's a lovely thing but would never win a beauty contest. This plant was part of a flask made from a seedpod collected from a fence post on the highway somewhere in the middle of nowhere outside Darwin. So you can imagine its cultural requirements. This plant hates being cold and wet but regularly flowers and the flowers last for six weeks or more. It has elongated white petals and short sepals and a deep purple colouration in the throat.

There is always benefit in having a name. This gives the ability to make some judgement about type of flower and cultural conditions. In the Cattleya cluster and novelty, there were quite a number of Brassovola nodosa hybrids. This species has star shaped petals and sepals and a long broad lip with a flared end. This characteristic is dominant and you will generally find that all its offspring have these features.

We don't often see Zygopetalum orchids at the meetings. These plants have a long multiflowered spray of greenish flowers with a large flared white, purple striped lip. Some of these have the most exquisite perfume. They are worth a place in the greenhouse for this feature alone. Plus the flowers are generally long lasting.

May your plants grow well and quickly grow to specimen size.

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Cultural Notes

Phrag. Perseus Highclare HCC/AOC

The parents of this plant are Lindleyanum (capsule) x Sedenii (pollen) and was first registered in 1892, first awarded AM in 1893, so it's no new comer to the scene although not often found around the benches. I purchased this plant several years ago and it has produced flowers every year.

The plant is situated in a "dome" roofed house between two normal shade houses, the result being heavily shaded morning and afternoon and under one layer 75% shade cloth for the hottest part of the day, this appears to be beneficial in the development of the flower spike, generally being vertical. If you experience a flower spike going sideways, "DON'T" tie the spike back, place a stake in "FRONT" of the spike and "PUSH" it back gently, you will discover it takes very little encouragement for the flower stem to straighten naturally, the end result is flower spikes up to 50cm tall that only need staking for transport.

Watering is daily except when raining or overcast and warmer months I stand the plant in a saucer of water. The mix is 1/3bark, 1/3 large perlite and 1/3 coconut husk, and in the top quarter of the pot I mix a sprinkling of Organic Extra, this mix works for me and tends to result in overall healthy growth and slightly darker foliage and mostly free from any unsightly brown marks. Fertiliser is once a week.

This Phrag consistently produces quality blooms, is easy to grow and is a worthy addition to any collection.
