# Plants Worth Noting

Another month when there were lots of plants to choose from, the first one to take my eye was Epi. porpax: this plant had a mass of foliage and flowers with olive green sepals and petals and burgundy lip and was growing on a slab of tree fern.

These plants like filtered light and should not be exposed to the midday sun, and grow in cool to warm conditions. They are best mounted on cork or tree fern and watered often while actively growing, good drainage is needed so that their roots can dry out.

Lc. Little Susie Orchidglade: always a plant that I can not pass by without stopping to admire. This plant had 7 beautiful dark lavender flowers with darker labellums. They grow in free draining media with a weekly feeding, they like to dry out between waterings. Grow in bright indirect light with 50/60% humidity.

Den. Roy Tokunaga x Silver Wings: This plant had 5 sprays of white flowers with a lemon lip with a purple stripe, there is another 2 spikes of flowers to come out. These plants like to grow in a small pot for the size of the plant. Keep moist and feed weekly in spring and summer, and reduce water and fertilizer in the cooler months

The pick of the night for me was Dtps Ox Firebird. This well grown plant had a spray of 6 beautiful purple petals with darker purple edges and another 2 flowers to come

Grow your phals. in warm to hot conditions with 60/70% humidity and low light. The media can be sphagnum moss or any free draining mix that will retain the moisture. [I have 1 of these plants and I hope that it will be as good as this one.]

# Show Thanks

Once again Marian and her helpers in the kitchen excelled themselves.

### Plant of the Month

The Plant of the Month for April was, for the first time, a Phalaenopsis – Dtps Hsinying Palabe x Dtps. I-Hsin Honey Girl.

We purchased this plant from Ken and Heather Smart in November 2010 as a flowering size plant. This is its second flowering. One of the great advantages of Phalaenopsis is that the flowers last a long time. This particular plant was on the show bench at our Autumn Show and is still presentable enough to have on display in the house.

It was potted up into a 150mm pot in January this year (mainly due to the size of the plant), into a medium bark and perlite mix of approximately 3:1. We fertilise using Horticultural Solutions HSO12 or HSO22, and occasionally Arcadian.

We use Rovral to fungicide monthly, and Mancozeb or cinnamon to treat individual break-outs. When repotting we spray all our plants with Hysan. One disadvantage with Phallies is that they are very susceptible to fungus and bacterial infections, so it is very important to be vigilant and treat it immediately.

As our Phallies are grown in a "glasshouse" our conditions are a little more controlled, by using an evaporative fan in summer to keep the temperature to no higher than 26-28 degrees, and an oil heater in winter at night to keep it above10-12 degrees.
