Cultural Award March 2014

Dendrobium Topaz Dream

Plant was purchased about 12 months ago from Burbank Orchids. As I do with most purchases it was repotted into my own mix of small bark, jumbo perlite and small charcoal using a 100mm pot. Dens love to be pot bound.

Topaz Dream is made up of 6% *Den. canaliculatum* and 94% *Den. Bigibbum*

This orchid is grown in a large shade house with solar weave and shade mesh on the roof at total 60% shade and shade mesh at 50% shade on the sides. The solar weave allows for watering to be controlled and this is very important in winter especially for dendrobiums. One of the best tips ever given to me, when I first started to grow Dendrobiums was to grow them under a solid roof.

Generally this orchid is watered ever 2 to 3 days in summer and about once per week in winter. This depends on how hot or how cool the weather is and I supplement this watering with misting especially the aerial roots that will develop with good culture.

When watering or fertilising I make sure to water the top of each pot and water until water or fertiliser runs through the pot.

This dendrobium is fertilised all year round alternating between foliar feeding and deep water fertilising. Horticultural solutions HSO 12 and HSO 22 is used for deep water fertilising and each is used alternately once per fortnight. With foliar feeding the same products are used adding Hy-san, Amino K and Seasol. This is sprayed over the foliage on alternate fortnights to deep water fertilising.

This orchid is positioned hanging high in the shade house where it gets maximum light and heat and good air circulation.

The fertilising regime described above is quite complicated to put on paper and if anyone wishes to discuss further then please approach me and I will be happy to discuss further.

Plants Worth Noting

Firstly I would like to comment on the Dendrobiums over the last couple of months, they have been exceptional and of very good quality and a real credit to their growers.

On display at the last meeting was a *Bulbophyllum longissimum* which is always eye catching with the petals growing to about 11inches long. Native to Thailand, Burma and Malaysia at low elevations, it is epiphytic with conical pseudobulbs. The flower stem is about 8" [20cm] long and produces 5-10 fragrant flowers with long cream coloured petals with pink stripes. This orchid likes to be moist all summer and never let dry out with reduced watering in winter. Also there were several specimens of *Bulb. medusa* on show, a striking little orchid with its head of flowers looking a bit like a mop head. It also comes from the South East Asian region and likes Phalaenopsis type conditions.

On display was a member of the Catasetinea group namely Cycnoches Jumbo Puff. We don't see many of this group on the benches but hopefully they will become more popular. The 2 beautiful sprays of 5cm plus flowers in bright yellow was very nice indeed. They like lots of water and fertilizer in the growing season and a lot of neglect in winter as they are deciduous and go dormant. Just keep a close eye on them in summer as spider mite seem to particularly like the soft leaves and can decimate them rather quickly as I have now learnt.

That's all for now, happy orchid growing.

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Cultural Award for April 14

Bulbophyllum longissimum

Bulbophyllum longissimum is a native of Burma and Thailand. Once established it is extremely easy to grow, it has a semi-rambling habit and seems to prefer to grow out of the pot. This is not such a bad thing as the pendant habit of the flower spikes makes a better presentation of the 40cm plus blooms. One must be watchful as the flowers are developing as the long petals can easily get caught up on the bench and will never straighten up properly.

The mix is 1/3 jumbo perlite, 1/3 small bark and 1/3 small coconut chip, please note that the coconut chip must be treated with Cultiplex prior to potting. The mix is kept moist at all times, only reducing the watering during winter.

The open roof is 75% shade cloth and fertilising is once a week with whatever I have to hand. The plant seems free of any vermin and mould problems and has never received any preventative treatment in any way.
