Attendance at QOS Meeting

EDOS was invited to be the Guest Society at the Queensland Orchid Society Inc's Meeting on Monday, 11 May, 2015.

The Committee would like to Thank those members who attended on the night and took plants along for tabling. The EDOS table was quite impressive, with a good variety of plants on show, almost outnumbering the QOS members' plants.

Cultural Award April 15

Dendrobium Memoria Kip McKillop x Dendrobium **Mighty Mite**

This plant is 8 years old, grown for a seedling purchased from Aranbeen Nursery. It is grown hung high in the shadehouse under a solar weave roof &

receives high light, heat & good air movement. The plant is potted in a 15cm pot with large coconut bark & perlite as the growing medium.

Watering is once weekly through the warmer half of the year then tapering to once every 2 to 3 weeks in winter. Fertilising is HSO22 once per week during spring & the first half of summer then changing to HSO12 once per week for the second half of summer & autumn. The plant foliage is sprayed in mid May with Envy for cold weather protection & to stop leaf drop.

The plant produces a number of flower spikes with up to 20 flowers per spike & then a second flowering of less vigour. This plant appears easy to grow & flower, the only disappointment is the flowers tend to look down.

Phragmipedium Peruflora's Cirila Alca (A primary hybrid of Phrag. kovachii and Phrag. dalessandroi)

Now known as: Phragmipedium Fritz Schomburg (A primary hybrid of Phrag. kovachii and Phrag. besseae var. dalessandroi)



Whilst I find all primary hybrids interesting because the influence of the parents is still very evident, this plant was chosen as Plant worth noting because of the story surrounding the discovery of its *Phrag. kovachii* parent. Back to that in a moment though.

For crossings utilising the parents involved in this instance, made in say 2007, *Phrag.* Peruflora's Cirila Alca was the registered hybrid name (grex). But, a seedling of a crossing made today with the very same parents, would be a *Phrag.* Fritz Schomburg. This arises because the non-*kovachii* parent of this primary hybrid was known as *Phrag. dalessandroi* up until 2007. The currently accepted name for that parent is *Phrag. besseae* var. *dalessandroi*. The grex of the primary hybrid resulting from a crossing of *Phrag. kovachii* and *Phrag. besseae* is *Phrag.* Fritz Schomburg. If we update a Cirila

Alca to the grex Fritz Schomburg, it might be a good idea to note that the non-kovachii parent is *Phrag. besseae* var. *dalessandroi* as it could be that in the future it might be *Phrag. dalessandroi* again. While the grex Fritz Schomburg has been in use for the crossing of *Phrag. kovachii* and *Phrag. besseae* for quite some time, it has in recent time been "gate-crashed" by what would previously have been seedlings of *Phrag.* Peruflora's Cirila Alca. Phew! somewhat difficult to follow at times.

While *Phrag. kovachii* and *Phrag. besseae/dalessandroi* are both promising parents, it is *Phrag. kovachii* that has considerable intrigue attached to it and is linked to orchid enthusiasts being charged in the USA with federal crimes for illegally importing and possessing an endangered species under the CITES convention.



Phrag. kovachii would undoubtedly be the most exciting orchid discovery of recent time - this remarkable new orchid with by far the largest flower of the phragmipedium genus has flowers that are a bright pink colour (perhaps peach and raspberry) and of very good shape, with wide petals and dorsal sepals. Awarded cultivars in excess of 180mm are common. The discovery of this species generated such excitement that many wild populations in Peru were soon decimated by illegal collection. There are reports that plants were being offered for sale for \$US5,000.In May 2002, James Kovach, a nurseryman of Virginia, USA went to Peru with a friend, Lee Moore, an orchid trader. While there, James Kovach was offered a big colorful Phragmipedium of which he bought 3 pots. His mate Lee Moore proclaimed, "You've got the Holy Grail of orchids."

Kovach arrived back in Miami in early June 2002 and took his new discovery to Marie Selby Botanical Gardens in Sarasota for identification. It was subsequently named *Phragmipedium kovachii* after the discoverer. As all species of Phragmipedium are protected under the CITES Convention, the Peruvian Government, in June 2002, asked the USA Fish and Wildlife Service to investigate Marie Selby Botanical Gardens. In June 2004, the Tampa District Court in Florida, found Kovach guilty of violating the *Endangered Species Act* and gave him two years' probation and a \$1,000 fine for bringing an endangered flower into the USA. Selby Botanical Gardens and one of its top scientists formally pleaded guilty to accepting and handling a rare orchid that the federal government claimed was smuggled in from Peru. A plea agreement meant the gardens would pay a \$5,000 fine and submit to three years' probation for the misdemeanour charge under the *Endangered Species Act*. Their horticulturist, Wesley Higgins, agreed to a plea deal specifying house arrest for six months, probation for a year, and a \$2,000 fine.
