### Seaweed Tonic.

There is still plenty of confusion amongst gardeners and orchid growers about whether to use seaweed products.

Seaweed extract is available in liquid and powder forms and often finds its way into liquid and pelleted fertilizer products.

However, seaweed itself should not be considered a fertilizer, as it does not contain the major nutrients of nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium that all plants need

Seaweed contains cytokinins and auxins and is known to build the disease resistance and heat-frost tolerance of plants by thickening the plant cell walls.

It is also known to stimulate root development.

It has a natural chelating effect that help unlock nutrients already within the soil / potting media making them more available to plant roots. Use of seaweed also supports good soil organisms such as fungi and bacteria.

All these benefits justify the regular use of seaweed in all gardens and orchid houses.

### Plants Worth Noting

What a beautiful display of Orchids and such a wide variety of genre. There were too many plants worthy of note to mention them all. So I decided to follow up on the plant commentary and talk about the Indian species Dendrobiums as they are one of the orchids that inspired me to start growing orchids 30 plus years ago.

Den. lindleyi , Den. cretaceum and Den chrysotoxum were on display and also there was a Den Mousmee X Den. thrysiflorum. These had the typical pendulant clusters of flowers which make these orchids so spectacular. They are any easy orchid to grow and seem to like the climate conditions in Brisbane.

These epiphytes native range is in tropical parts of India where they are found growing on trees. Their native climate is monsoonal tropical, so plenty of water and fertilizer are required in spring and summer. Keep them on the drier side during winter.

If there is a drawback to these orchids it is that they grow too well and soon grow into large specimens. If let go they become root bound and make repotting a nightmare, I know as I let mine get away from me when I was young and ended up dividing them up with an axe. They did recover but it took a few years to get them back to their best. The amazing thing was, that even though the plant was 3 times the size of the pot it was in, it still produced masses of flowers. So if you have the room they are always worth a spot in the orchid house. Whether you are beginner or an experienced grower, the Indian species will give a spectacular show for your efforts and it's great to see them making a return to the benches and shows.

Another plant that caught my eye was Renanthera monachica. What a beautiful display of flowers. This plant's native range is the lowlands in the Philippines, mainly the island of Luzon. The bright orange with fine red spots make this a bright and beautiful flower even though they are only small. I have a soft spot for this genre, but unfortunately not the talent to grow them well. They like to grow with plenty of air movement around their roots and lots of humidity and warmth. This is a smaller member of the Renanthera family so it is well suited to those that are space restricted in the orchid house.

That's all for now.
