Cultural Notes August 17

Someone has blundered. Perhaps it was me. I'm old and forgetful so my apologies for missing the deadline for my cultural award in August- not once but twice. I had a significant birthday during the month and was somewhat distracted. All the better babies are born in August don't you know. Better late than never so I have had more time to think. What was the question?

Dendrochilum tenellum - perhaps.

Most people's reaction is to ask, "Is that really an orchid." They do resemble grass. The trick is that there are in fact many different species that look similar. As well as some variation in colour forms.

Gary Yong Gee has informed me, subsequently, that this plant is actually *Dendrochilum spathelatum*

Dendrochilum tenellum has longer flower sprays and a different lip. There is also Dendrochilum tiongianum and Dendrochilum williamsii.

These plants grow in high mountain rainforests in the Philippines. I have about 30 different plants and at least three of the species.

The plants are relatively easy to grow. Mine tend to thrive on neglect except when one gets to hide behind larger leafed plants. They need good humidity and should never be allowed to dry out.

Their decline in dry conditions is quite rapid as there is limited reserves in the pseudobulbs as you would expect. I grow mine in a mixture of Polystyrene, Perlite and TREF Peat moss at a ratio of 1:1:1. It doesn't seem to matter what shading you have. Mine varies from 50% shade to quite dark conditions.

Give one a go.
