#### Cultural Award

#### Laelia jongheana

This species found in Brazil,,produces long racemes of upright & pointed flat 1 or 2 flowers in late Winter to Spring. It grows at elevations of 1300 - 1600 meters in small patch forests.

Laelia jongheana is a very uniform species with color varying in the intensity of the pink-magenta segments through to alba.

I grow my *L. jongheana* on a tree fern mount under 70% shade cloth where it is hung 2ft (60cm) from the roof facing east where it receives maximum light without damaging the foliage, and plenty of air movement.

My orchids are watered prior to the fertilising regime of half-strength organic or inorganic fertilizer alternately, not allowing the mount to dry out too long in between watering. Reduce watering during the winter months.

This is a rewarding species to grow.

### Plants Worth Noting

Good blooms graced the benches on the Thursday meeting. The variety of blooms in size, shape, colour and texture is always a pleasure to observe. I have always had a soft spot for the small flowers. The Phalaenopsis flowers always look attractive and the Vandas are eyecatching, however I picked three out and I like species.

Dendrobium farmeri was worth noting. This one comes from India, Nepal, Thailand through to Malaysia and grows in forests with cool dry winters. Oh – how much and when to water??? Then there was the long name Dendrobium viz! goldschmidtianum. I like its synonym – D miyakei. This one comes from Taiwan and has a showy purple bloom.


Last was Laelia jongheana, which is a montane specie from Brazil which at one time was in the Sophronitis genus. It is highly endangered in the wild – so cultivation is an essential part of orchid preservation. This flower shows itself – the three sepals stand out, complementing the two petals, while the lip sets the flower off – an excellent flower as opposed to the round and filled in idea of hybridisation. This proves the diversity of arrangement in orchid flowers is their strong point.
