Cultural Notes

Dendrochilum glumaceum

This species occurs in Borneo & the Philippines where it grows as an epiphyte up to a 2,300m altitude. These plants grow into specimen size in a few short years. The single leaf of each pseudobulb can be up to 40cm long. The flowers are scented.

I grow my plant hanging in a 4.5m high shade house at about 2.4m from the ground.

The potting is medium bark, perlite and charcoal, repotted every 2 to $2^{1}_{/2}$ years.

Watering depends on the weather.

Fertilising - with Horticultural Solutions Duett every 2nd or 3rd watering. These plants like plenty of air movement.

Plants Worth Noting

Firstly a big thank you to E.D.O.S. committee for giving me the opportunity to jot down a few notes in the newsletter. As most of our loyal members attended on the night, there is not much point telling you all what a great display there was on the night as you have already seen it. What I would like to do is try and give a little information on a few plants which I found of interest.

In the Species Monopodial section there was a beautiful Rhynchostylis gigantea with 2 long sprays of pure white blooms . This species originates in Thailand through Indochina and comes in many colour forms, from white to spotted to solid red, with a few new colours being developed such as apricot , yellow and even blue. As it is a lowland grower it prefers warmth and high humidity all year and if given these requirements I have seen good sized plants blooming in less than 2 years from flask.

Moving on in the Paph hybrid section there was a Tony Semple with two tall influorences which held their heads above all others on the night. This is a primary cross between Paph . haynaldianum and Paph lowii which are similar in appearance but coming from different regions. Paph haynaldianum comes from the Philippines , while lowii is found growing in the Malay peninsula through to the Celebes. Both species can be found over a large range of elevations which can be warm monsoonal through to almost freezing winters , also both species can be found growing as epiphytes or as lithophytes

with their roots down in the leaf litter. Because of their similarities it would be an obvious cross to be made by our early hybridisers and what a great job they have done.

Now for those who don't grow intermediate dens you are certainly missing out as there was a very desirable plant of Den Jimmy Concert which had 3 tall well arranged sprays of deeply coloured blooms. The only problem I had here was the R.H.S. says there is no such animal so I could not find any information to pass on, or how to grow this robust genus. I did find a reference to a Jimmy Concert that had been mericloned some years back in an old orchid catalogue but perhaps the name never made it to registration.

The next plant to catch my eye was a beautifully grown plant of Dendrochilum glumaceum which had grown into a lovely specimen. This large group of orchids are easy to grow and this particular clone comes from the Philippines where it receives equatorial type conditions, always moist from constant drifting cloud with near year round constant temperatures. Here in Brisbane we need to protect this genus from hot drying winds in summer and chilly nights in winter. If you are able to provide these conditions in your house please leave a space for me to move my bed in.
