**Plant Labels** - It is very important when benching plants that labels are easy to read and correct. A clearly written label makes it much easier for everyone to read, and avoids the possibility of a plant being given an incorrect name on the Prize Cards and in Competition Results, or even placed in the incorrect category.

For any members who are unsure of, or would like to confirm that their plant labels are correct **before** benching, (either spelling or registration of crosses) EDOS will have available on Friday night prior to benching of plants, the Orchidwiz database for members to check their labels. Please see Ann Kable or Janelle Girdlestone. **Orchidwiz is available at every Monthly Meeting for checking labels**.

**Member Number** - Your Member Number is on the newsletter envelope following your name, or available from the Plant Registrar. This number needs to be used if you are benching and/or selling plants.

**Show Attendance Register -** – It is EDOS Inc. policy that **ALL** persons attending; exhibiting; benching or selling orchid plants at the Spring Show sign the EDOS Inc. Attendance Register, so please make sure you sign when you arrive at the Hall.

**Attendance Book** – for Insurance Purposes it is necessary for Members to sign the Attendance Book when helping out at the Show

As per our By-Laws, -refer in particular to EDOS Inc By-Laws 5.6 and 5.7 - plants which are deemed to be of an unsuitable standard will be removed from the Sales Tables.

### Cultural Award August 16

#### Stenorrhynchos speciosum

About the Orchid - medium sized cold growing terrestrial orchid found growing in South America from Venezuela, Brazil, Peru, and Columbia to Argentina. Grows in semi deciduous forests at elevations from 1200 to 3000 metres. Likes to grow in heavy shade and flowers from Mid Autumn to Winter

Owners Comment - Orchid is grown in a covered shade house with 60% shade on roof, including solar weave and 50% on sides. Four fans run during daylight hours to circulate hotter air that gathers in the gable roof. This orchid is a cool grower and requires low light at around 800 to 1000 foot candle. This orchid is potted in a terrestrial mix with a few chook pellets mixed in.

As it is a cool grower in has been positioned in a tray just a couple of inches off the gravel floor and placed under a bench facing North where it gets more filtered sun in Winter. During summer the gravel is watered a few times a day and once per day in winter to keep the growing area cool. Even though it is under the bench the orchid still receives good air circulation due to fans circulating the air.

Feeding - Orchid is fertilised using Horticultural Solutions HSO22 and HSO12 alternating fortnightly between both 12 months of the year. Rate is 1 gram per litre. On alternate fortnight orchids are foliar fed using HSO22 and HSO12 at same rate above but also adding Amino K, Cal Mag and Hy-san to the foliar feed.

Watering - In summer the orchid is watered 2 to 3 times per week and once per week in winter. However take note of the prevailing weather conditions and alter the

frequency depending on whether it is extremely hot summer days or cooler than normal conditions. The orchid house is also misted regularly especially on hot days.

Potting Medium - This orchid grows best in a terrestrial mix of good potting mix with a little perlite and small bark, charcoal and chook pellets added.

Any Other Cultural Notes - There are two varieties of leaves on *Stenorrhynchos speciosum* with the one shown at Species Society having green leaves and another variety with mottled green and white leaves.

### PLANTS WORTH NOTING

There was a rather varied range of plants on the bench at the August meeting. One of the plants which took my eye was Angraecum sesquipedale. There is something so clean and crisp in this flower that it takes one's attention. This orchid originates in Madagascar. It is found in the hot lowlands along almost the entire east coast of Malagasy Island. Plants grow on the trunks of trees in light shade or diffused light at the edge of woods, usually at less 100 m. They like plenty of air movement and are found most often on sloping tree trunks with roots creeping over the bark and then dangling in air, sometimes for several metres. The plants grow in coastal areas with heavy annual rainfall that is fairly evenly distributed throughout the year with no pronounced dry season. It seems to like our growing conditions here is SE Queensland.

Another plant which was benched at this meeting was Angraecum Veitchii. This plant is a cross between Angraecum sesquipedale (described above) and Angraecum eburneum. Both plants are warm to hot growers, and grow quite well in our conditions. One could assume that this plant, with a name spelt this way, would be a species, however it was registered as a hybrid in 1899, by J Veitch and Sons. In today's nomenclature this type of naming is not used for hybrids as it creates confusion between species and hybrids.

This hybrid has been awarded at least 33 times, although surprisingly only 1 award (CC/NSW) has been awarded in Australia. I guess that means that the owners are challenged to grow this plant to an award standard in the near future!
