### CULTURAL AWARD - APRIL

### Dendrobium oligophyllum

I bought this plant from Aranbeem Orchids in September 2008 when we called in on our Society bus trip. Mind you I did have second thoughts because it was such a tiny plant but it has turned out to be a delightful orchid to have in one's collection.

Den oligophyllum (syn. tixieri) is a cute little novelty den. It flowers in clusters at the top of the cane from very early on, being only 2 – 4 cm in height. The plant is compact with clustered cylindrical pseudobulbs which should grow to 3-4 or (6)cm long and about 7 mm in diameter. The long lasting flowers are white with green stripes in the throat and are approximately 2.5 cm across. Since I have had the plant it is rarely without flowers. It has not been through the winter in my orchid house as yet so we shall see if it rests through the cooler months.

I grow *Den oligophyllum* in a pot with medium size coconut peat and a little perlite in the mix. It has been situated on the Northern side of the house about 1 m high bench (shaded by dividing fence) and watered 2-3 times weekly. It receives fertiliser at the same time as other orchids eg weekly. My orchid house has 50% shade cloth on walls and roof with the addition of solar weave on the roof.

Den oligophyllum is found at around 600-700 m altitude in its natural habitat and is distributed in Vietnam and in the Southern central as well as South Eastern areas of Thailand.

This little plant has been a joy to grow without any extra fuss due to its size.

I would certainly recommend it to you. "Do try it"

### **CULTURAL NOTES**

Coelogyne Rochussenii

### (refer to 'Around the Benches' for photo of this plant)

As with most plants there is a story behind how they come to live in your backyard. The idea of growing this plant came to me when I saw a photo online with a curtain like cascade of flowers, which to me was worth trying to source and ultimately grow.

Approx 5 years ago I purchased a seedling and have potted it on each year, hoping for something like what I had seen on the net. This year I was rewarded with 23 pendant inflorescences with a total of almost 700 flowers. I'm stunned to think a first flowering could produce so many sweetly scented flowers.

These plants are normally found growing on trees in lowland areas and over rivers in south-east Asia. This plant has a spag ball centre, bark and perlite outer with a liberal sprinkling of Roosta Boosta throughout the mix. It is grown under 75% green shade cloth and watered with tank water twice per week.

Getting the plant to the meeting in good condition was a challenge in itself. After some trial and error I settled on two long lengths of twisted glad wrap crossed over the plant and tied to the timer stand. This wrap has surprising strength and is not as harsh as twine. The stand with the plant attached was then placed on the floor behind the passenger seat and tied with a bungy cord to the seat. End result it made it to the meeting in one piece.
