### PLANTS WORTH NOTING

It is good to see the species outnumbering the hybrids. First one of note was Bulbophyllum picturatum. It was in a 4" pot and had 2 spikes with 10 and 6 flowers. This species Lindley calls Cirrhopatelum picturatum in 1840 with Bulbophyllum picturatum Reichenbach1861.

This plant comes from India, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam around elevations of 1000m. Sometimes it grows near waterfalls and so likes a goodly supply of moisture with a moisture retentive potting mix and light shade.

Good to see 2 Dens of note – amethystoglossum and farmeri. D amethystoglossum comes from Luzon in Philippines. It grows on mossy limestone cliffs around 1500 m. Year round humidity but easing off in winter – picky eh!! It was well flowered. D farmeri flowered well this season. It can be called D densiflorum var farmeri. It comes from the foothills of the Himalayas – 300 to 1000m, and from India, Burma, Thailand to Malaya. It is one that likes good light. Dendrobium is a big genus with a wide range of species and conditions so it was good to see these.

Next is Vanda tricolor. There are 70 species of Vanda genus and grow from China, Himalay as to New Guinea and Northern Australia. Golden Guide states V tricolor may grow to several feet tall with flowers that vary in colour and shape – great for the connoisseur. Colour is from white to yellow with red brown spots and twisted petals - don't the judges like that. A W Dockrill mentions it being in Arnhem land but apparently wider spread in Indonesia. In ABC's Gardening Flora's Orchids states it is from Indonesia and grows on rocks or trees on fringes of lowland forest. It blooms in Autumn/winter and has perfumed flowers. It is propagated by the keikis shooting from the main stem which when rooted can be cut off or the main stem severed to get two plants - good when they grow so tall.

I didn't single out a particular plant but the Dendrobium soft canes are out in force this year. Judging around the benches, it was so good to see so many of size of flower and plant and colours. They are relatively easy to grow if – that proverbial if- you get the right position. Hybridisation has done so much for this section. It is certainly good to see the overall perspective of this section.

Lastly around the benches I didn't see so many Cymbidiums this year. Of course I didn't get to Toowoomba. There was one on the bench, a hybrid – good arching spike but colour and shape was mediocre.

Spring has sprung and almost gone so good growing and flowering for summer.

### NOTICE TO AMEND BY-LAWS

At the recent E.D.O.S Inc. Committee Meeting on Thursday 01 October 2009, the Committee decided to make two proposals to the E.D.O.S By-Laws.

The first proposal will be made in relation to By-Law 5.4 which currently reads:-

"The Committee will ensure a commission is deducted from these sales which shall be credited to the Society. The Society will deduct 10% commission of the proceeds of sale from members and 20% commission from commercial growers".

The NEW PROPOSAL to By-Law 5.4 is as follows:-

"The Committee will ensure a commission is deducted from these sales which shall be credited to the Society. The Society will deduct 15% commission of the proceeds of sales from both members and commercial growers".

The second proposal will be made in relation to By-Law 5.5 which currently reads:

"The Committee may from time to time determine the number of orchid plants a Society member can sell at any general meeting or show. The number of orchids for a Society member is 60 plants however unlimited number of flowering orchid plants for a commercial grower although first preference will be given to flowering orchid plants by the Plant Sales Convener".

The NEW PROPOSAL to By-Law 5.5 is as follows:-

"The Committee may from time to time determine the number of orchids a Society member can sell at any general meeting or show".

Rule 42(2) of the E.D.O.S Inc. Constitution is applicable - 'A by-law may be set aside by a vote of members at a general meeting of the association'.

### **FIRE ANT CO-ORDINATOR**

At the Spring Show, a number of issues were raised concerning those members who were or not in declared 'Fire Ant' areas.

Whilst E.D.O.S Inc Management Committee are attempting to ensure our members are fully informed of the relevant legislation and compliance requirements, it has been decided necessary for a designated member to be appointed as the society's Fire Ant Co-ordinator Officer.

At the current time, this activity has been addressed by the past and present Secretary of E.D.O.S. Inc. however there is a need for a member of the society to be appointed to this position 'full-time'.

The duties of the Fire Ant Co-ordinator is not onerous and mainly relate to the (i) recording of members bringing in orchid plants for sale at both the autumn and spring shows; (ii) liaising with the Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries; and (iii) updating members on current issues – i.e. new fire ant declared areas.

If interested, please discuss with **Secretary Ken Webster or Barbara Allen** to gain an understanding of this particular role within the society. As stated, it is not an onerous task – by taking on this role – you will greatly assist in the reduction of the Secretary's current workload.
