Member Number - Your Member Number is on the newsletter envelope following your name, and this number should be used if you are benching and/or selling plants.

Fire Ant Register – Legislation requires that Members sign the Fire Ant Register before Plants can be accepted for either showing or Sales. This Register MUST be signed before Plants can be accepted into the Hall. **More information further on in the Newsletter.**



CULTURAL AWARD AUGUST 2009 Laelia superbiens

I purchased this plant as a 3 lead division of a much bigger plant from the Plant sales at West Brisbane Orchid Show about 7 years ago, with a name tag Schomburgkia. superbiens. I potted it on when needed, until it outgrew a 300mm port pot, the only thing I could fit it in was a Yabbies sieve, where it is growing today.

The species occurs in Mexico, Honduras and Guatemala where it grows on trees in the open or damp forests or on rocks in low altitudes. Some have been recorded with 13' or 4m inflorescences.

I have been growing it in a shade house with 2.7m high roof with 70% shade cloth and 50% cloth on the walls, until this year moving it to a new section with no cloth on Eastern wall and 4m high roof with 70% shade cloth.

I give it more water in Summer than most orchids, fertilizing with organic and HS022 in the growing season. Once every week insecticide with Eco Oil, Azamax and Eco Rose fungicide, also follicle feed with Amino K and Hy San every 2rd week in Summer. A lot of air movement is essential.

This is a very rewarding and easy orchid to grow. Try one.

FIRE ANT COMPLIANCE INFORMATION

As advised by the Inspector from Program Compliance Risk Management, Fire Ant Control, **Points to note are:**

Our new meeting place at the Uniting Church Hall, 420 Wondall Road, Manly West, is now in a **RESTRICTED AREA**.

- All members who are in an Unrestricted Area are able to bring their plants for competition at general meetings and Shows, but must comply with the requirement that <u>on no account must their plants</u> <u>be put down and come into contact with the ground</u> (even in a box) at any time during their visit and remain elevated at all times until their return home.
- Members from Restricted Areas continue as normal with their potted plants having a plastic tag with ARMP 438, their EDOS Mbr No (not Site Inspection No) and the meeting date inscribed on it and placed in each pot.

Fire Ant Compliance for EDOS Spring Show

As mentioned at our last meeting members of the society have to comply with changed Fire Ant Rules. This is due to reinfestation by a different species of fire ant originating from Wacol, and by flight have spread down the Bulimba Creek system as far as Pinkenba.

There appears to be more members who are now included in the Restricted Zone.

Put simply – every member must complete a Fire Ant Declaration (FAD) which is A4 size; eg

- Those in Non Restricted areas complete and sign FAD ticking No. 2.
 Keep FAD with you for your return trips to your home from show.
 Produce FAD if requested to do so by a DPI & F Inspector if one is about.
- Those in <u>Restricted</u> areas complete and sign FAD – ticking either (b) or (c). Sale pot plants <u>must</u> be drenched with either Cyfluthrin OR Chlorpyrifos if you wish to sell them. The FAD is to be produced to a DPI & F Inspector on request.
- The sales tag is acting as a mini FAD and is to be attached to each sale pot with the following information on it:

Member's Name; Address
ARMP No 438
Site Inspection No.
Address of Show
Date of Show 18 – 20 Sept 2009
This item complies with DPI & F requirements
Please keep tag for 12 months.

PLANTS WORTH NOTING

As one entered the hall one could not miss the orchid that stood over head height (dependant on one's height!) that stood on the floor. The tag stated it was Schomburgkia superbiens x Laelia tenebrosa. (Pictured on the Wee Leprechaun's page) Having looked at photos and read descriptions of the two species, if this is a cross as stated, then the second named species did not have much influence. It certainly had the flowering habit of Schom superbiens, and the flowers were very much alike. Laelia tenebrosa has large pseudobulbs and the flowers are only a little alike. It certainly stood out and no wonder the owner need his truck for transport! These species come from the Americas.

Next is Coelogyne flaccida – it was well flowered – not spectacular but showy, as many flowers make up for being what they are. The raceme hangs down, making the flowers harder to observe. These easy to grow orchids come from Nepal to Thailand, and the epiphytic ones grow on trees from 900 to 2300 m. Some grow as lithophytes on rocks that are in open areas.

Dendrochilum is a good and interesting genus to grow, but hard and expensive to get. Ddc glumaceum is an excellent example, coming from Borneo and Philippines and is epiphytic around 2300 m altitude. The racemes take quite a few days to flower completely on the hanging length, but have a nice show when that happens.

Dendrobium gracilicaule was interesting because of its colour and being a small plant. In Dendrobium Orchids of Australia by W T Upton the above term doesn't exist any more., it being a basionyn. It is Den macropus subspecies gracilicaule. In Pridgeon's book it is still Den gracilicaule. It comes from Australia to New Caledonia. I would deduct that the ones we see mostly come from South Queensland. The colour ranges from yellow to yellow-green with red to brown blotching. So there is quite a range of colours, so it was good to see one that is different from the norm. Marcopus means long footed and refers to the pseudobulb length.

Two others stood out viz. Cymbidium Peewee and Paphiopedilum Shun-Fa Golden, but enough for now.
