

## Cultural Notes September 2023

#### Den. primulinum

The judges in their wisdom have suggested that I write about how I grow *Den. primulinum*. It was the large plant at the September meeting growing in a basket with pink and yellow flowers.

Having grown orchids for 45 years I cannot remember where I purchased it, maybe from Fame Orchids, in those days they did sell a lot of similar dens. Todd Marshall was probably still going to school at that time. Den. primulinum is widespread in Northern India down to the Philippines. Many years ago, I divided the plant in two, they went into large plastic baskets and I lined them with shade cloth to stop media falling out. I use bark and charcoal with large perlite, both plants looked identical at that time. The first hung under a large poinciana tree, seldom watered, very little fertiliser and was struggling to grow. The other was hung in the orchid house (on a swivel having copious amounts of water and fertilizer, it flourished).

A lot of these den's are pretty well pest free, apart from me, the *primulinum* under the tree was not touched by the dreaded denrobium beetle. Having a lot of epis, vanda and speciosum in the garden I am waving a green flag for the beetle. About three years ago the beetles were everywhere so I bought a two litre of Lawn Beetle and Grub Killa made by Richgro and available at Bunnings. This is a premixed product that you can click on your hose, I can be in action within 30 seconds of spotting my target. Because it is so easy to spray, every time I see a beetle which is every few weeks when the beetle is active, I spray on the orchids and plants in the garden as well as the outside of the orchid house as I have observed them on the shade cloth.

The spay works by stomach action, they stop eating straight away but may take a day or two to die. The active constituent is Bifenthren at 4.8 grams a litre. This is the one our last guest speaker spoke about; the safety instructions are "do not inhale and wash hands after use". I would not recommend drinking it either as I prefer a Great Northern.

This season I have seen only one beetle at the time of printing, so have only sprayed once, there it is – my secret is out!

## Cultural Notes November 2023

#### Bulbophyllum lobbii

This plant is found widespread throughout southeast Asia from Assam in India through Burma to Thailand and into Borneo and Java, where there is heavy rainfall most of the year, and perhaps a little less during their short winters.


It is an epiphyte and grows in warm to hot humid forests at elevations of 750m to 2000m. It likes medium light levels along with a medium temperature range.

This plant can grow to a very large size and will do best in a shallow tray. However, if one divides the plant, it is likely to sulk and not flower for a couple of years.

I have found that *lobbii* does best in high light, same as the Cattleya, with about 50% shade cloth. Water twice weekly, in the warmer weather and perhaps once every one or two weeks in the cooler months. They like misting daily in summer and a bit less in winter, but always let the dryness of the day dictate the misting on a particular day.
